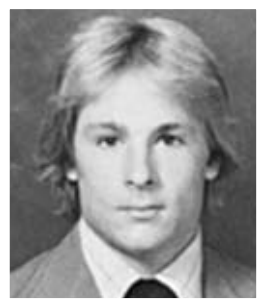

## ■ MUCH STILL TO BE DONE

BUILDING A VISION FOR THE FUTURE WILL TAKE SUSTAINED EFFORT

As we approach the first anniversary of the launch of our Share the Vision campaign it's time to review our accomplishments. In April of 2004, it was announced that we would be constructing a one-of-a-kind Center for Science and Technology on the second floor of our existing building. This spectacular 2,000-square foot Center provides our students access to state-of-the-art technology, first-rate lab facilities, distance learning resources worldwide and more. Our students are already benefiting through their use of the

Center this school year.

As we balance the mind and body development of our student body, the next phase is already underway. The bulldozers are hard at work on our next phase, the much anticipated renovation of our football/soccer stadium and amenities. By July, the dust will have cleared and it will be replaced by our new, enlarged artificial turf field, which will not only host our Fighting Irish football battles, but also provide a regulation-size field for our Irish soccer matches. Due to

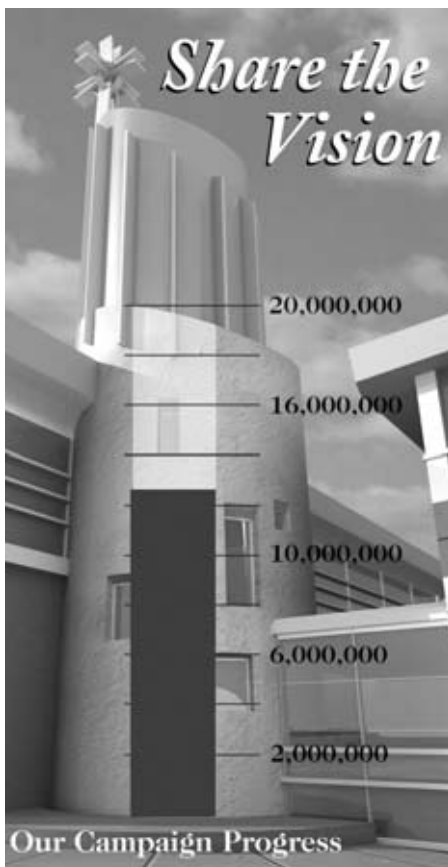
your overwhelming feedback and support, additional improvements to Cistone Field were announced in December including new closed bleachers, new field lighting, modern scoreboard, new press box, new perimeter fencing, landscaping and covered entrance pavilion with a picnic-like setting and grilling area. This will all complement the originally planned new maintenance-free, artificial turf. With approximately 85% of our student body participating in athletics, it is important we provide safe, adequate facilities for them. In addition, these improvements to Green Street Stadium and Cistone Field permit STVM to better accommodate our community youth involved in CYO or other peewee athletics.

It is an exciting time to be a member of the STVM family and our overall community.

Our heartfelt thanks to all who have seen the importance of the capital improvements and have chosen to support STVM through gifts to the Capital Campaign. # ■ CHIONCHIO RECEIVES ALUMNI AWARD FROM UNIVERSITY OF AKRON

## MARY JO KAUFMANN CHIONCHIO V60 SELECTED TO RECEIVE AWARD

Mary Jo Kaufmann Chionchio has been selected by the Education Alumni Society of The University of Akron to be a 2005 recipient of the Distinguished Education Alumni Award. She graduated cum laude in 1964 with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Education, Biology Major. In 1970, she earned a Masters in Physical Education from Kent State University and in 1982, returned to The University of Akron to study law.

Currently the Science Department Chairperson at St. Vincent- St. Mary High School, Mary Jo has been a part of the teaching staff since 1964. She teaches Biology and Advanced Placement Biology and has taught Health and Physical Education. Some of her



classroom accomplishments include the development of the Science Inquiry Project Curriculum and the establishment of the award winning Science Inquiry Team for District and State Science Day.

Mary Jo was the driving force as Project Director of the newly initiated Partners in Progress program with The University of Akron. This program gives the high school students access to university caliber resources and gives the university's College of Education students experience in teaching science to high school students using the inquiry based model. She assisted in the development of The Center for Science and Technology, a new science inquiry laboratory at St. Vincent- St. Mary High School, which facilitates the program.

Through the years, Mary Jo has coached Irish women's track, volleyball, and basketball teams, as well as men's varsity and junior varsity golf teams, leading many to state championships. Her history of coaching has also resulted in her winning the Kiwanis Club Recognition Award, Ohio Basketball Coaches Association Statewide Award, Touchdown Club Award, and Dapper Dan Special Award, as well as inductions into the Summit County Sports Hall of Fame, Women's Tri-County Basketball Association Hall of Fame, and the St. Vincent- St. Mary High School Athletic Hall of Fame.

To round out her accomplishments thus far, Mary Jo was a 1999 recipient of the Fr. Thomas F. Mahar Outstanding Alumni Award from St. Vincent- St. Mary High School.

## BRIAN WILLIAMS V60 ELECTED TO STATE OFFICE



Brian Williams V60 was elected to the Ohio House of Representatives, 41st District in the November 2004 election. After having served for six years, Brian retired as the Superintendent of Schools in Akron in

April of 2001. 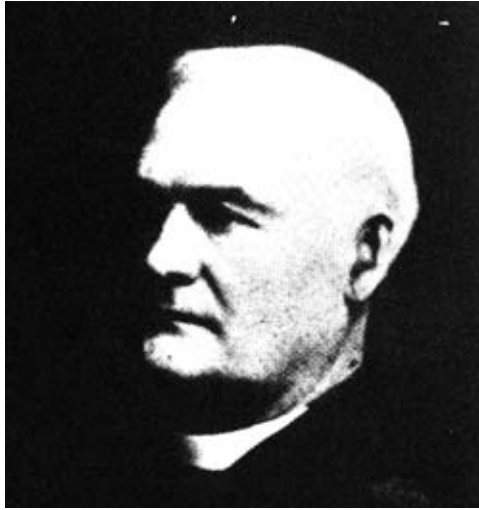

## Fr. Thomas F. Mahar Outstanding Alumni Award 2005

**T**he Fr. Thomas F. Mahar Outstanding Alumni Award honors living graduates of St. Mary, St. Vincent, and St. Vincent-St. Mary High Schools who exemplify the spirit and values of Catholic secondary education in one or more of five related areas: ministry, service to youth, service to school, service to community, and professional achievement. Since its inception in 1979, this award has been presented to sixty-nine outstanding alumni of our school.

### Doris Gibson Simonis V48



Doris and her family, including sister, Barbara V51 and brother, David V53) came to Akron, Ohio in 1936 and settled in Firestone Park. She attended St. Paul Elementary School before attending St. Vincent High School where she concentrated on science and math. Her college years were spent in Cleveland at Ursuline College where she earned a B.S. (chemistry) in 1952. This background was put to use as a research chemist as well as an instructor in chemistry at Ursuline.

Doris moved to Cleveland after marrying Robert W. Simonis, Jr. in 1953 and began a family that grew to include eight children and their spouses, twenty-five grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. The family was Doris' primary occupation, but she did manage to teach high school science classes, earn the M.A. in education in 1974 at Marycrest College, Davenport, and a Ph.D. in science education in 1977 at the University of Iowa. She completed several post-doctoral projects before heading westward in 1981 to the University of Montana, Missoula. There she joined the departments of education and of environmental studies, teaching and advising graduate students, and was active on the Faculty Senate.

In 1988 Dr. Simonis joined the College and Graduate School of Education at Kent State University where she taught science teacher candidates and practicing teachers for the last seventeen years. She

organized and directed the Master of Arts in Teaching program (for career changing adults) for seven years, and was the Chair of the Teaching Leadership and Curriculum Studies department for three years before retiring to give most of her professional attention to grant-funded outreach programs in chemistry and physics education for middle grade and high school teachers, team-taught graduate courses that she has coordinated at various campuses of Kent State University.

Writing, photography, and international travel reflect Doris' current interests. She has written and published poetry, authored seven books, forty journal articles, four book chapters, and more than fifty funded grant proposals. Dr. Simonis has also been an editor for professional organizations and publishers. She continues to develop her interests in international science education. Her self-assigned retirement project is to write some personal history about intersections of family, cultural shifts, science, and art. She enjoys gardening and experimenting with shade-loving plants such as mosses.

### Barbara Koltan Easterling M51



Barbara J. Easterling brings to her career the strong principles of trade unionism she learned as a child growing up in a Polish family of coal miners and rubber workers in Akron, Ohio. After graduating from St. Mary High School in 1951, she launched her telephone career as an operator at Ohio Bell, she had incorporated those principles into her own life by the time she joined CWA Local 4302 in Akron.

Barbara is the first woman ever to serve in Communication Workers of America's (CWA) second highest office - that of secretary-treasurer. She also became the first woman in history to serve as secretary-treasurer of the AFL-CIO, the 13-million member federation of labor unions.

Barbara has made "shattering the glass ceiling" a rallying cry. As CWA secretary-treasurer, she is responsible for managing the finances and physical facilities of CWA. She serves on the union's three-member executive committee as well as on the strategic planning and budget committee which allocates CWA's resources and sets program goals. Barbara oversees the CWA legislative department and the union's retiree program. She serves as a member of the executive committee of the Union Network International — (UNI), the 17 million member worldwide labor federation — and is President of the UNI World Women's Committee.

Easterling served the local as steward, secretary and vice president before accepting an appointment by Ohio Governor John Gilligan to serve as chief of the Ohio Labor Division in early 1970. In 1973 she left state government to become a full-time CWA staff representative and later was promoted to administrative assistant to the vice president of District 4. In 1980 Barbara was summoned to Washington, D.C. to serve as an assistant to the president of the union, a position she held until her election as executive vice president in 1985. She and CWA President Morton Bahr ran for and were elected to office as a leadership team in 1992. She has held the office

ever since.

Barbara has received a broad range of honors and accolades during her union career. She was inducted into the Ohio Women's Hall of Fame in 1985 and received the prestigious Women's Equity Action League award in 1986. In 1992 she received the Midwest Labor Press Association's Eugene V. Debs award. She also is the recipient of the International Womens Democracy Center Global Democracy award, the Ellis Island American Legend award and the March of Dimes Salute to Labor award.

She has been a leader in the fight to raise money for the Elizabeth Glaser Pediatric AIDS Foundation, which has been officially designated as the union's "charity of choice."

Barbara is an executive committee member of the Democratic National Committee and co-chair of the National Alliance to End Homelessness. She also serves on the board of directors of the National Democratic Institute for International Affairs as well as the Faith & Politics Institute; is a member of the Spina Bifida Foundation and the Pediatric AIDS Foundation and serves on the executive committee of the United Way of America and its board of governors.

### Sandy Singleton Smith V60



Sandy Singleton Smith was born in 1942 to Norman and Mary Jane Singleton. She is the oldest of six children who grew up in Akron and Marietta, Ohio. Sandy graduated from St. Vincent High School in 1960. Her five children are all graduates of St. Vincent-St. Mary High School. In 2003, Sandy's oldest grandchild, Chevonne Smith, followed in her footsteps by graduating from her alma mater.

Sandy worked for thirty-nine years at Lucky Shoes. She was an exemplary leader at Lucky Shoes, especially in customer service where fellow employees looked to Sandy for guidance in dealing with the public. Many loyal customers insisted on her service even when she was no longer working on the sales floor. Her hard work ethics set an example that were an inspiration. Upon her retirement in 2001, she requested that, in lieu of a retirement gift, donations be made to establish a scholarship in her name at St. Vincent-St. Mary High School.

Always the consummate volunteer in the community, at St. Sebastian parish, Sandy served as a Eucharistic Minister and organized the presentation of gifts at the Contemporary Mass in Zwisler Hall. She also acted as a Mass coordinator. During her years with the Christ Child Society of Akron, Sandy prepared layettes for young mothers who live in local migrant farmer communities. Her ceaseless willingness to step up when needed set an example for all who know her.

Sandy's love for her alma mater drew her back in a big way after her retirement. She tirelessly worked the bingo program and volunteered in the high school wherever she was needed. She planned and assisted various mailings, campaigns, and committees. But most often Sandy could be found working in the bookstore where she was the only volunteer designated to work behind the counter. Sandy

was an integral member of the basketball ticket sales team during the years 2001-2003, when ticket sales were at a premium and being a ticket seller meant long and demanding hours in the booth. After the Alumni Association was re-established, Sandy actively participated as member and leader, serving as the Fr. Thomas F. Mahar Outstanding Alumni Award chairperson, President-elect, and most recently, President. Her service and dedication to the association is a reminder of the importance of giving back.

There isn't anyone who has attended an athletic event at St. Vincent-St. Mary High School who doesn't know one of the school's greatest fans. Her spirit and presence exemplified Irish school spirit at its best. Under any circumstance, Sandy attended most games and traveled to every basketball game during the LeBron years.

After all is said and done, this would not be complete without mentioning Sandy's greatest accomplishment, her children. Michele VM84, Marcy VM86, Barry VM88, Bryan VM89, and Brant VM91 are her pride and joy. She has loved them all unconditionally and raised them to be giving adults. She has instilled in them a love for family and a respect for others. It is this job which has given Sandy the utmost joy and her pride in her children and grandchildren does not go unnoticed.

### Mary E. Howard M68



Mary Howard, daughter of James and Catherine Hughes Howard, was the middle child of five children. The other children were four brothers.

All of the Howard children attended Catholic schools. Mary attended St. Paul Grade School and St. Mary High School, graduating in 1968. She attended the University of Akron receiving a Bachelor Degree in Education 1975 as well as Physical Education K-12 and Health Education 7-12. She has earned

graduate hours at John Carroll University, Walsh University, and Drake University.

Following graduation from St. Mary's and earning her degree in education, Mary began her teaching and coaching career that has earned her acclaim as one of the top volleyball mentors in the history of volleyball in the state of Ohio.

Mary's accomplishments began at Hoban High School where, between 1979 and 1999, her volleyball teams won 448 matches while losing only 149. During that time the Lady Knights won 20 more games each season between 1980 and 1992. Her Hoban teams were sectional champs 23 times, district champs 13 times, regional champs and state finalists nine times, state runner-up twice and state champions four times in 1980, 1990, 1991, and 1992.

Her tenure at Hoban also included a number of personal awards including Akron Beacon Journal Coach of the Year in 1988; six achievement awards, one lifetime achievement award, and one coach of the year award from the Ohio High School Volleyball Coaches Association; four coach of the year awards from the Akron Touchdown Club and the Dapper Dan Club state volleyball coach of the year award in 1991. Other awards include the Akron Touchdown

Club Youth Award and the Akron Women's History Project Award for athletics. Mary was included in the Hoban Athletic Hall of Fame in 1994 and the Summit County Hall of Fame in 2000.

Other than her inaugural year as volleyball coach in 2000 at St. Vincent-St. Mary High School, Mary's Irish teams have been on the winning side of the net. On September 20, 2003, Mary Howard achieved what only four other volleyball coaches in Ohio have – 500 victories in a coaching career. September 23, 2003 was designated as Coach Mary Howard Day. On February 15, 2004, Mary received from the Dapper Dan Club the William Falor Award for Career Achievement.

### Marty Johnson VM77



One of six siblings to graduate from St. Vincent-St. Mary, Martin Johnson was a scholar athlete, earning ten varsity letters in high school. He was all Northeast Ohio Conference in football and baseball, and point guard on the basketball team. Recruited to play football by Princeton University, "Marty" left Ohio for the east coast in 1977.

After choosing cultural anthropology as a major, Marty traveled to Northeast Brazil his junior year to research the impact of a large development project on a remote fishing village. While there, he grew interested in the impact of conventional economic development projects on poor communities and the environment.

In April of his senior year at Princeton, Marty and a few other students founded Isles, Inc., a nonprofit organization set up to develop and test new ways to create environmentally sound development in lower income areas. Declining the high paying job offers after Princeton, Marty chose to build an organization that had a first year budget of \$10,000. Shortly after graduation, he moved to Trenton, New Jersey, a struggling city thirteen miles south of Princeton.

Marty pursued the development of Isles. He hired Elizabeth Napolitano, an extraordinarily talented woman who would later become his wife. Working together, they grew Isles at a gradual rate each year, living simply while also raising three sons in Trenton.

Today, Marty is still President and CEO of Isles, a nationally recognized community development and environmental corporation. With a mission to "foster more self-reliant families in healthy sustainable communities," Isles develops energy-efficient affordable homes, community gardens and other environmental programs, savings accounts and homeownership opportunities, and neighborhood and regional planning projects. Isles also operates an alternative school, training high school dropouts in the construction and other trades while they gain their diplomas. ([www.isles.org](http://www.isles.org)).

In addition to his work at Isles, Marty founded other successful organizations and projects in New Jersey and nationwide, including New Jersey Community Capital, the New Jersey Regional Coalition, and the Success Measures Project. Marty is a co-founder of the New Jersey Housing and Community Development Network and other support organizations.

On sabbatical from Isles in 1996-97, Marty served as a visiting

professor at Princeton University's Woodrow Wilson School for Public Policy and International Affairs, where he taught courses on community development and urban economic development.

In addition, Marty serves on the board of trustees of several organizations, including his alma mater, Princeton University. He is on the board of directors of Capital Health Systems of Trenton, a nonprofit organization that runs two hospitals. He is also a trustee of the Mercer Trenton African American Chamber of Commerce.

Marty is on the Board of Advisors to the National Council of Churches, the Environmental and Occupational Health Sciences Institute in New Brunswick, NJ, and GE Capital's New Markets Program in Wilton, Connecticut.

For his work at Isles, he has received awards from the United Nations and President George Bush in 1988. He earned the Princeton University Peace Prize in 1992, Humanitarian of the Year award from the New Jersey Chapter of the National Conference on Community and Justice in 1997, the New Jersey Pride Award from New Jersey Magazine, and numerous other awards.

Martin and his wife Liz have three sons, Jeremiah, Lon and Colin. Jeremiah and Lon are students at Princeton University.

### Curtis Wilson VM83



Curtis Wilson was born in Akron, Ohio in March 1965 to the late Edward L. Wilson (LTC, US Army) and Barbara A. Wilson-Coleman and grew up with his two sisters, Victoria and Sharon. He began his education in pre-school at the age of 4 in Heilbron, Germany, with family stints in Saipan, Guam, Hawaii, East Coast and the Midwest. Curtis graduated from St. Vincent-St. Mary in 1983, receiving a two-time Akron Beacon Journal Player of the Year Award. Curtis holds a

Bachelor of Science in Business Administration from the Ohio State University (1988) and completed an MBA with a concentration in Finance at Morgan State University in Baltimore, Maryland in 1995.

Curtis has worked for American Express for fifteen years. In March of 1990 he started working as a Territory Manager in the Washington D.C./Baltimore area after working for two years at Proctor and Gamble in Buffalo, New York. Over the past fifteen years, he has held seven different positions in the Mid-Atlantic area and Northeast. He has been promoted five times at American Express in both the Establishment Services and The Corporate Services Division. 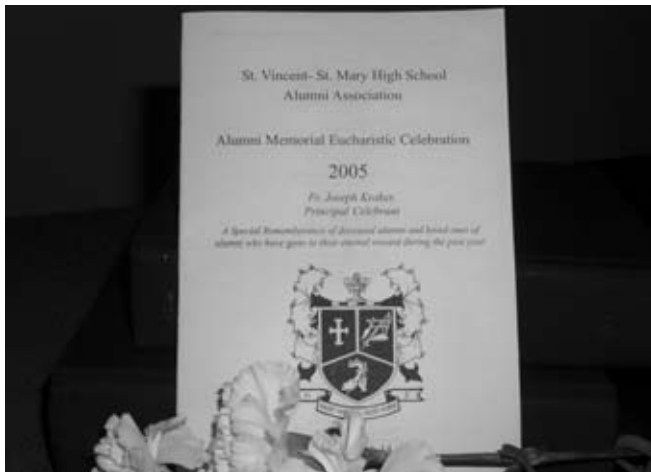

### Senior Breakfast, Ring Ceremony and Canned Food Drive

The week after Thanksgiving break, the senior class gathered together for a breakfast hosted by the faculty. The continental breakfast was held in the student center and gave the students a chance to mingle and spend some quality time with each other. At the breakfast, the seniors received their shirts and hoodies with the '05 class design which they are now allowed to wear every Friday. The cans that were donated to the food bank will provide 5,543 meals for the needy in the area.

**Joe Burdon VM96** was a four-year letterman, three-year starter, and two-year Captain for the Varsity Basketball team from 1992-1996. He was twice selected as the Plain Dealer Player of the Week and received various state and local honors. Joe also played college basketball and earned his degree from John Carroll University.

**Mike D'Andrea VM78** received eight varsity letters, four each in baseball and football. He earned All-City honors for baseball in 1978 and multiple All-City honors for football. Mike received a football scholarship and earned his bachelor's degree from The Ohio State University.

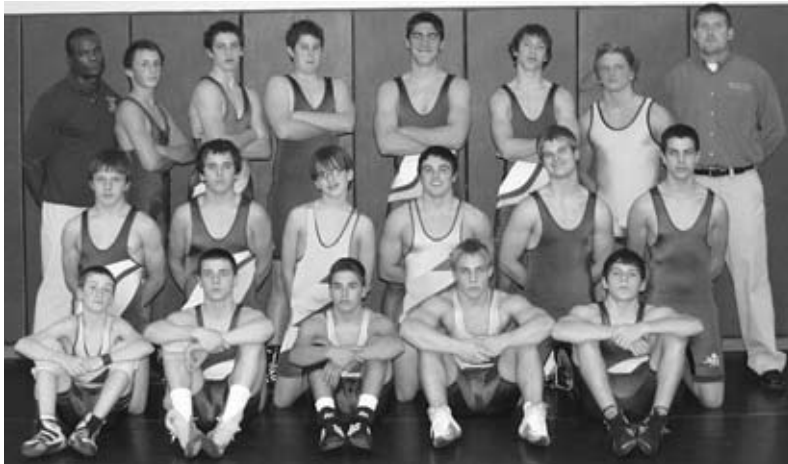
### Girls Basketball

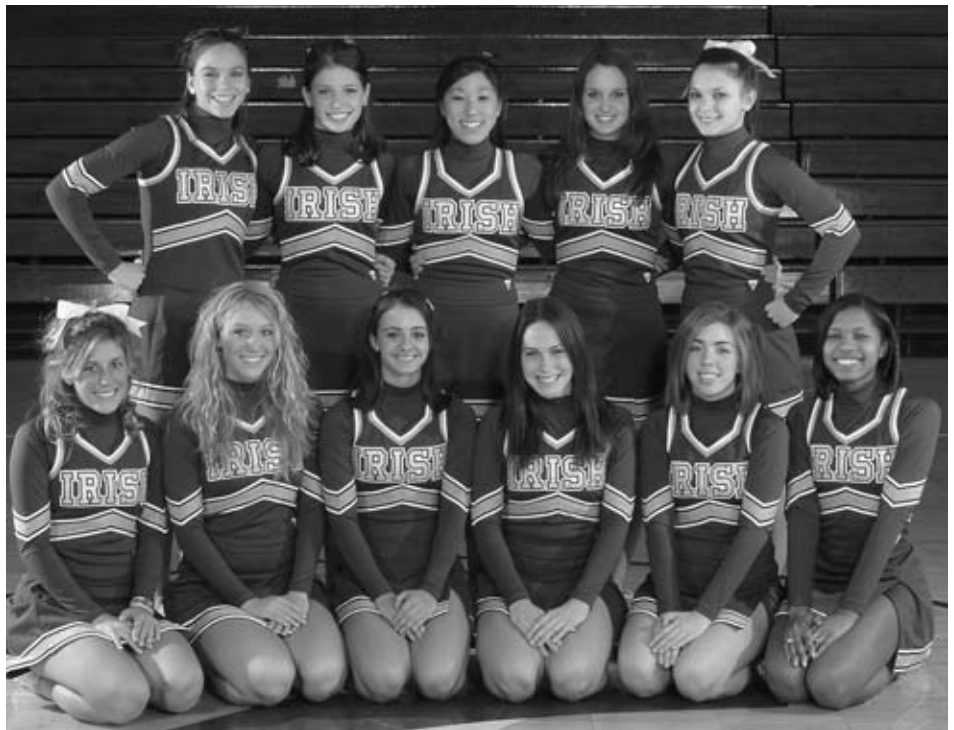
## Welcome New Cheerleading Coaches
