Make sure you are using your Navigator program! Finish the career assessments and continue to explore the majors that interest you. Junior year is quickly approaching and the hunt for a college with the major you need will be less stressful if you put in some research time right now.

Communication Tips

Good communication can be hard when you are having a disagreement. Here are a few helpful tips:

- Don't argue over trivia. In other words, don't sweat the small stuff. Keep small issues small.
- Stick to the issue at hand. Don't bring up past issues.
- Use "I" Statements. "I felt annoyed when you", rather than, "You annoyed me when..."
- Let your opinions stand on their own merits. Don't bring in other people's opinions.
- Try to stay sitting down. Relax your muscles and don't forget to breathe. Pacing around the room and showing your agitation can escalate a situation.
- Don't use absolutes such as "never," "always," "shouldn't," "should." They are irritating and often inaccurate exaggerations.
- Be aware of your feelings. Saying, "I don't think you care about our friendship" isn't as accurate as, "When you forgot to call and invite me to the movie, it made me feel left out and uncared for."
- Don't throw abuse around. Calling names will only build up a wall around the person you are trying to communicate with.
- Try not to block the conversation. Don't interrupt, go into a long winded speech or expect others to read your mind.
- Take a break. If you are getting too heated, share with the person that you need some personal space to cool off and will revisit the conversation when you can think clearly.

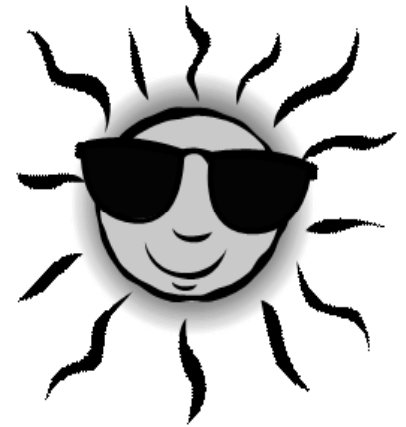

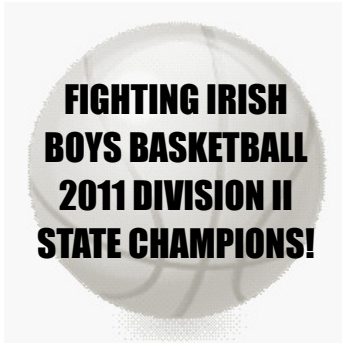
