TIMELINE FOR USCCB DEVELOPMENT OF DOCTRINAL FRAMEWORK

In this issue of Irish Items you will find the Doctrinal Framework for curriculum revision that came from the "synthesis" of the Course of Preparation of the Catechism of the Catholic Church that was presented in the last issue of Irish Items.

Doctrinal Elements of a Curriculum Framework for the Development of Catechetical Materials for Young People of High School Age (Doctrinal Framework)

Timeline for the USCCB Development of Doctrinal Framework

1992 - Vatican approves *Catechism of the Catholic Church*

1994 - *Catechism of the Catholic Church* published in English.

1995 - Ad Hoc Committee on the implementation of the Catechism initiated. Archbishop Alfred C. Hughes, Chairman.

- *The Protocol for Assessing the Conformity of Catechetical Materials with the Catechism of the Catholic Church* is approved for experimental usage.
- Textbook assessment begins.

1997 - Archbishop Daniel Buechleinn reports to the USCCB on the assessment of textbooks in comparison to the Catechism and finds:

1. There is insufficient attention to the Trinity and the Trinitarian structure of Catholic beliefs and teachings.
2. There is an obscured presentation of the centrality of Christ in salvation history and an insufficient emphasis on the divinity of Christ.
3. There is an indistinct treatment of the ecclesial context of Catholic beliefs and magisterial teachings.
4. There is an inadequate sense of a distinctively Christian anthropology.
5. There is a trend that gives insufficient emphasis on God's initiative in the world with corresponding overemphasis on human action.
6. There is an insufficient recognition of the transforming effects of grace.
7. There is a pattern of inadequate presentation of the sacraments.
8. There is a pattern of deficiency in the teaching on original sin and sin in general.
9. There is a meager exposition of Christian moral life.
10. There is an inadequate presentation of eschatology

(Reference: Oral Report to the General Assembly of Bishops, Archbishop Daniel Buechlein, 6/19/97.)

Feasibility Study initiated as to whether or not USCCB should write its own catechetical series as is done in other countries.

June 29 - *editio typica* of the Catechism released.

September - Administrative Committee of USCCB approves *The Protocol for Assessing the Conformity of Catechetical Materials* with the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* as standard for textbook review.

2000 - Feasibility report is given to USCCB. Bishops decide not to write own series, but to work with publishers.

- At Bishop's annual September meeting with publishers, publishers request national curriculum and scope and sequence for schools. Bishops and publishers realize there is some commonality in elementary school curriculums, but not in high school curriculums.
- Catechism Committee decided to recommend this to Committee on Catechesis.

2002 - Committee on Catechesis formed with Archbishop Daniel Buechlein as first chair.

Catechism Committee recommends national curriculum to Committee on Catechesis.

2003 - January - first meeting of Committee on Catechesis - accepts recommendation from Catechism Committee and determines to begin with high school because there is little commonality in content at this level.

June - Second meeting of Committee determines the focus of curriculum should be on person of Jesus Christ. Committee decides that Catechesis at high school level should help students:

- Learn about Christ
- Encounter Christ
- Be transformed by Christ.

Committee discusses 8 courses that would focus on Christ in some manner.

2005 - Spring - first national consultation on the *Doctrinal Framework* with diocesan staff, high school staffs, and parishes.

- Shift occurs with this consultation. The 8 courses now become the 6 CORE courses and 5 Electives.
- The national curriculum is renamed the *Doctrinal Framework*.

2007 - Summer - 2nd national consultation held to prepare for vote by Bishops.

November - *Doctrinal Framework* approved unanimously by Bishops.

2008 - *Doctrinal Elements of a Curriculum Framework for the Development of Catechetical Materials for Young People of High School Age* published by USCCB.

Diocese of Cleveland Timeline for Implementation

May 6, 2008 - Bishop Lennon calls a meeting of high school principals, theology chairs, and teachers to address the topic of the *Doctrinal Framework*. Bishop establishes a High School Religion Task Force to study the *Doctrinal Framework* and propose methods of implementation.

Fall 2008 - The Task Force forms and consists of two committees - an Advisory Committee and a Curriculum Committee

- Task force meets several times during the 2008-2009 school year.
- Discussions of possible implementation are reported to Bishop.
- Curriculum Committee formulates a Theology survey to assess the teaching of religion in the high schools in light of the *Doctrinal Framework*.

Spring 2010 - *Results of Theology survey are collated and reported to Bishop.*

• Bishop directs a high school Theology Curriculum Writing Team be formed.

- Writing team is formed with representatives from 16 of the high schools in the Diocese. Training for writers is recommended.
- A series of in-service sessions focusing on the six CORE courses in the *Doctrinal Framework* are held for the writers at the Office of Catholic Education.

Summer 2010 - The Theology Writing Team meets for two weeks to work on creating a draft curriculum based on the *Doctrinal Framework*.

Fall 2010 - Staff from the Office of Catholic Education and two members of the writing team continue to meet to work on the curriculum.

- The Advisory Committee recommends that seminars be offered all Theology faculties on the content of the 6 CORE courses. A plan for training is submitted to Bishop.
- Bishop approves plan and suggests presenters.
- November - Bishop review work done by writing team and suggests changes.
- Professional Development sessions begin addressing each of the CORE courses identified in the *Doctrinal Framework* for Theology faculties.

Spring 2011 - Professional Development sessions addressing each of the CORE courses identified in the *Doctrinal Framework* continue.

Under the direction of the Bishop, staff from the Office of Catholic Education revise the curriculum materials previously prepared by the writing team. Professional Development sessions addressing each of the CORE courses for Theology faculties conclude.

Office of Catholic Education staff plan training on course content on electives.

Bishop approves plan for training and suggests presenters.

Summer 2011 - Staff from the Office of Catholic Education continue to work on the theology curriculum to prepare it for publication and distribution to the high schools of the Diocese with the goal of presenting final draft to Bishop by December 2012.

According to directives of the Bishop, nine professional development sessions are offered to high school theology teachers addressing the electives found in the *Doctrinal Framework*.

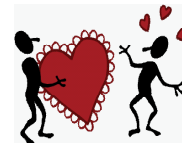
