Maureen Harrigal is a lifelong learner and passionate educator at St. Vincent-St. Mary High School. Maureen is the daughter of Nora and William Holleran and is one of ten children. Maureen's parents came from Ireland and eventually met at an Irish Dance Club in Cleveland. Catholic education and a strong work ethic was very important in her Irish household.

The Hollerans focused on God, family, and education, and were taught to be close to one another, which they still are today. They enjoy having annual family reunions in different states where their siblings live. Maureen went on to marry her husband, Jerry, and the two have three daughters Danielle Cianciola, Traci Mathieu, and Tami Blevins. They also have four grandchildren, Mason and Estella Cianciola and Madison and Michael Mathieu.

Growing up, Maureen and her siblings attended school at St. Joseph and Holy Family Grade Schools. Seven of her siblings then attended St. Vincent High School, while two of her sisters attended Our Lady of Elms High School. One brother attended Walsh Jesuit and was in the first graduating class. After high school at St. Vincent, Maureen studied at Kent State University on a four year academic scholarship. She was a member of the French Honorary Society, Pi Delta Phi, and her majors were in French and English. Upon graduation, Maureen taught French for five years at Our Lady of the Elms before beginning her career at St. Vincent-St. Mary High School in 1977. According to Maureen, "I returned to teaching at STVM in the 1977-78 school year when my sister Nori Dettling told me the school had an opening for an English teacher. She was teaching history and English at STVM at the time."

Maureen's passion for Catholic education led her to complete 38 successful years at our school. During her time at STVM, Maureen taught French, English, Freshman Global Studies, British & American Literature, AP Composition & Literature, and Journalism. Maureen also held the role of Department Chair of the French Language for three years. She was awarded the Diocesan Teacher of the Year and was recognized in Ohio Magazine and Who's Who in American Teachers. Maureen also was active in the Forensic Program for seven years; held the role of English Department Chairperson since middle of 1980's; was a member of the Curriculum Committee for 16 years and member of the LPDC committee (teacher licensing) since the 1998-99 school year.

Maureen reflects back on the highlights of her times here at STVM and has many fond memories of teaching. She has enjoyed the drama of Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet with students engaging in the fight scenes with noodles and teaching the folklore of mythology with the Odyssey. "Students love to take ownership of their gods and they do a fantastic job with their PowerPoints. Things like this make teaching a dream job. It is thrilling to see the excitement in their faces as they

engage themselves in class.” She also takes pride in her decoration of the faculty lounge with fellow teacher Barb Hilovsky. Together, they stenciled the shamrock on the wall and began decorating the lounge by seasons for all to enjoy. Finally, who could forget the great tradition that Maureen began with fellow teachers Mrs. Anne Bickett and librarian Mrs. Barb Wood of going to mass and breakfast at the Family Restaurant every Friday to end the school week?

Maureen ends by saying, “I have enjoyed teaching all my students at St. Vincent-St. Mary, as I have learned so much from them. They have enriched my teaching with all their interesting insights in literature that I never knew existed. These unique perspectives had me laughing with them many times. They have kept me up-to-date on what to wear, who is ‘cool,’ and have even helped me with my smartphone when I am not sure how to program something. Teaching is the best because every day is different and I always learn something new.

I will always appreciate the time I taught here because the teachers and students learn together, pray together, and play together like a family. I remember when past president Fred Ost addressed the faculty one day. He said he came to school every day with a smile because he enjoyed being part of the best high school in Akron. Yes, I come with a smile and leave with a bigger one for being part of the best Irish family of STVM.”

St. Vincent High School, Class of 1968



Pat Hart is humbled and honored to be a recipient of the 2015 Fr. Thomas F. Mahar Outstanding Alumni Award. Pat grew up attending St. Vincent Grade School and then St. Vincent High School V68. Pat came from a family with a long St. Vincent history. His parents were both St. Vincent High School graduates – Jim Hart 1933, and Elizabeth McAlonan Hart 1937. His maternal grandparents, Patrick McAlonan and Mary McGuire

McAlonan were both St. Vincent graduates. Patrick McAlonan, being in the construction business, helped in the original construction of Green Street Stadium. Interestingly, Pat’s great grandparents, John McAlonan and Madge McGarry, were married at St. Vincent’s by Fr. Thomas Mahar in 1887.

Pat’s sister, Ann Hart Panuska V65 and brothers Jim V71 and John VM75 are all graduates. Pat’s son, Patrick is a STVM grad VM99. Although Pat’s wife, Linda, is an Our Lady of the Elms graduate (’71), her family has a long history with our school as well. Linda’s father, Larry Walsh V44, brothers, Tim VM76, Jim VM77, and Tom VM82 and her sister, Mary Walsh Nervo VM84, are all graduates. The tradition continues with his nieces and nephews. Finally, Pat’s legal assistant for the past 26 years, Ann Brown, is a STVM graduate VM81.

Pat married Linda Walsh Hart in June of 1978. They have two adult children, Patrick and Colleen. Patrick is living and working

in Columbus, Ohio. He is employed with JP Morgan Chase Bank. Colleen is living and working in Washington D.C.; and is employed with Hilton Worldwide.

Following high school, Pat attended The University of Akron and graduated in 1972 and earned his JD from its School of Law in 1975. Pat served as a prosecutor for the City of Akron for two years before becoming an assistant law director. He left the service of the city for the private practice of law in 1980. Pat ultimately joined Scanlon & Gearing Co., L.P.A. (now The Scanlon Group Co., L.P.A.) in 1988 and served as a managing partner from 2000 – 2009.

Pat has served as an adjunct professor of trial advocacy at The University of Akron School of Law and has taught law classes at Malone College. He is a member of numerous professional organizations and has served on the Board of Trustees of the Akron Bar Association. He served as president of the Summit County Trial Lawyers Association (1996 – 1997) and on its Board of Trustees as well.

For many years, he was active as a youth coach for his children’s sports teams and served on the Board of Trustees of the West Akron Baseball League (WABL). Talk about crazy! Pat also served for many years on the Board of Directors for CYO and Community Services, serving as Chair of the Board in 2009 and 2010.

Most notably, he served on the school’s Executive Board of Directors (2009–2014), serving as Chair of the Board for three of those years. Pat adds, “I feel blessed in many ways. Daniel Boarman

St. Vincent High School, Class of 1970



Daniel Boarman was born and raised in Cuyahoga Falls by parents Marvin and Stella Boarman. The Boarmans were members of Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish, where Boarman and his two sisters, Kathy and Kim, attended grade school. Boarman attended St. Vincent High School and graduated in 1970, one of the last

classes to graduate before the merger. In 1969, Dan met his lovely wife Sandra George, who also graduated from St. Vincent in 1970. They married in 1974. Together they have four wonderful children; Annmarie, Daniel Jr., Marisa, and Anthony.

After graduating St. Vincent High School, Dan Boarman continued his football career at Indiana University where he was a 3-year starter for the Hoosiers as an offensive lineman. After his college career in 1975, Boarman returned home to join John Cistone's football staff and became an influential component of the team's success as the defensive coordinator from 1981-1988. In addition, Boarman served as STVM's head baseball coach and led the team to two state championships in 1986 and 1989. As a result of his accolades as both a player and a coach, Boarman was inducted into the Greater Akron Baseball Hall of Fame in 2001. As a coach at St. Vincent-St. Mary, Boarman was an integral part of five state championship teams.

In 1989, Boarman took on the role of defensive coordinator at Massillon High School under then head coach, Lee Owens. After a victorious season with the Tigers, Boarman felt ready to step into the position of head football coach with the Copley Indians. As Copley's head football coach for 17 years, Boarman had a 117-71 record.

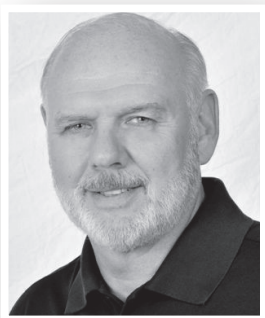
After 17 memorable years at Copley, Boarman decided to return to his roots on Green Street. At his press conference, Boarman said, "Probably my biggest motivation is Coach Cistone. Any success that I've had in this game, I owe to Coach Cistone. Any integrity that I have, any goals that I have set in my life, I really owe to him."

Since taking over the Irish in 2007, Boarman has posted a record of 78-24 (195-94 career), reached the playoffs seven out of the eight seasons, and has brought the program back to prominence around the state of Ohio. In 2012 and 2013, Boarman and the Irish accomplished the ultimate goal by winning the Division III OHSAA state championship in back to back years. The 2012 team finished 13-2 and the 2013 team finished with a 15-0 record, the most wins by a STVM football team in one season in the history of all three schools (St. Mary, St. Vincent, St. Vincent-St. Mary). In 2013, Boarman had his second player named Mr. Football and the first in St. Vincent-St. Mary history - linebacker Dante Booker.

Dan Boarman retired from Copley High School in 2014 after a successful high school teaching career. Today he enjoys spending time with his wife, children, and eight beautiful grandchildren. Boarman continues to coach the Fighting Irish football team in their legacy of greatness.

He is most thankful for the recent additions to his and Diane's family, sons-in-law Tommy McDonald VM02 and Anthony Bowen VM07.

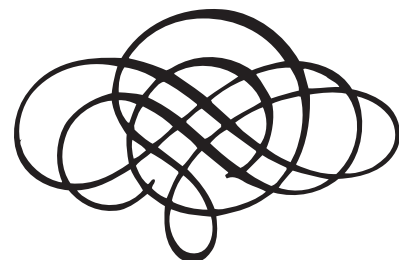
Jim is looking forward to the possibility of his young grandsons, Ben & James McDonald, attending STVM, where they also can experience a great sense of tradition, pride and community.

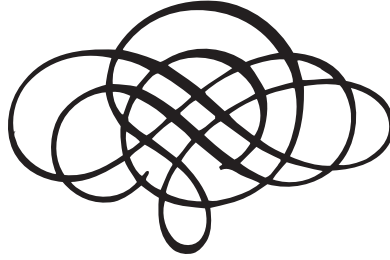
